ENTRY RULES FOR FOREIGNERS

Arrival form must be filled in by everyone: https://plf.uzis.cz/

The arrival of foreigners is governed by the so-called Covid traffic light.

Travel from countries with a low risk of infection (green colour):

- 1. Fill in the Arrival Form before entering the Czech Republic.
- 2. Take an antigenic or RT-PCR test before entering the Czech Republic or at the latest within 5 days after entering the Czech Republic. The result of the antigenic test is valid for 48 hours from the time of the test and the result of the RT-PCR test for 72 hours.

Travel from medium risk countries (orange):

- 1. Fill in the Arrival Form before entering the Czech Republic.
- 2. Take an antigenic or RT-PCR test before entering the Czech Republic or at the latest within 5 days after entering the Czech Republic. The result of the antigenic test is valid for 48 hours from the time of the test and the result of the RT-PCR test for 72 hours.

Travel from countries at high risk of infection (red):

- 1. Fill in the Arrival Form before entering the Czech Republic.
- 2. It is mandatory for persons who are not citizens or residents of the Czech Republic to take an RT-PCR test within 72 hours before travelling. Submission to the test can also be demonstrated by a digital EU COVID certificate.
- 3. All are required to submit to an RT-PCR test on the 5th and at the latest on the 7th day of arrival in the Czech Republic. Until a negative result is obtained, a respirator or other protective device must be worn everywhere outside the home

without an exhalation valve with a filtering efficiency of at least 94% (FFP2 / CN 95 class).

Travel from countries with a very high risk of infection (dark red):

- 1. Fill in the Arrival Form before entering the Czech Republic.
- 2. It is mandatory for persons who are not citizens or residents of the Czech Republic to take an RT-PCR test within 72 hours before travelling. Submission to the test can also be demonstrated by a digital EU COVID certificate.
- 3. All are required to submit to an RT-PCR test on the 5th and at the latest on the 7th day of arrival in the Czech Republic. Until a negative result is obtained, a respirator or other protective device must be worn everywhere outside the home without an exhalation valve with a filtering efficiency of at least 94% (FFP2 / CN 95 class).

Exceptions: There are exceptions to these conditions.

- When travelling from all countries, those who have had covid-19 disease in the last 180 days are exempted from the test and quarantined. (Need to demonstrate with a digital EU COVID certificate or a certificate issued by an authorised body in a third country approved by the European Union Digital Certificate Regulation (EU COVID).

- 2. When travelling from all countries, those who are inoculated are exempted from the test and quarantined. And their vaccination is in effect.

Condition:

- 14 days have elapsed since the complete vaccination and they hold a certificate according to the European Union Regulation and a digital EU COVID certificate. https://koronavirus.mzcr.cz/en/
- 14 days have elapsed since the complete vaccination with a vaccine that has been approved by the EMA or its equivalent and holds a certificate at

least in English from a third country. The models are listed on the website of the Ministry of Health and must include: data on the person being vaccinated, the type of vaccine administered, the date of administration of the vaccine, identification of the subject who issued the certificate and these data must be able to be verified by remote access directly from written confirmation. https://koronavirus.mzcr.cz/en/

- 14 days have passed since the complete vaccination with a vaccine that has been approved by the EMA or its equivalent in a third country approved by the European Union Digital Certificate Regulation (EU COVID).
